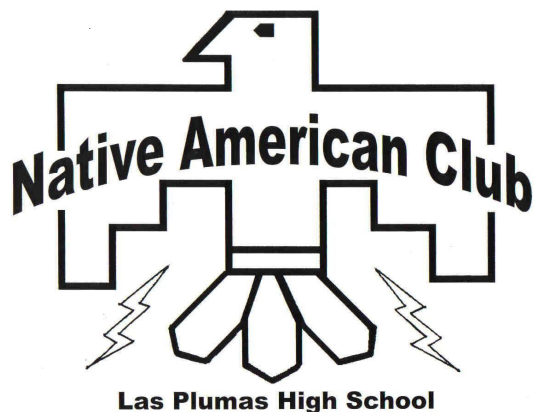

- **ATTENTION NATIVE AMERICAN ARTISTS** - The 4th Annual Butte County Intertribal Education Fair needs a logo for this year's event! We need your talent! Get recognized and show your native pride. Design an original (and school appropriate) logo that represents Native Americans of Northern California. The winning design will become a huge part of the Ed fair on March 1st and will be placed on t-shirts, flyers and banners. All submissions will be on display at the fair! The design should be an image only without lettering or word art on 8.5 by 11 inch paper. Submit art to Mr. David Devine in the library no later than January 31st, 2010.
- **The 4th Annual Butte County Intertribal Ed Fair:** The planning committee for the upcoming ed fair would like students from the NAC to help facilitate this event! We would help set up, then run our own informational booth during the fair and then help clean up afterwards. The ed fair will be on March 1st.
- **Maidu Nation Radio Show:** LPHS NAC students Gavin Antone, Rachel Arnold, Louis Steele and Shaina Appleyard have been broadcasting on Oroville Radio 107.1FM on a program called The Maidu Nation since the summer of 2009. On Tuesday, December 15th, Rachel Arnold, Tina Reszler (Mooretown Rancheria) and Brad Taylor (Berry Creek Rancheria) invited Mr. Devine (Teacher Advisor for the Native American Clubs) to the station to be interviewed. Mr. Devine was interviewed by student Gavin Antone. Items discussed were the purpose of the clubs, their importance to the local tribal community and plans for future events, field trips and activities. We really got the clubs out there! The students of the Maidu Nation program would like to have student members of the NAC from either high school come on the program and talk about what the clubs are doing or just anything Native American related! It's a great opportunity for the clubs to get their voice out there.
- **Ishi Day:** The Native American Clubs of both high schools have been invited to once again volunteer as teachers at Ishi Day in Hewitt Park. Volunteers will help teachers present Native American crafts, culture and music to hundreds of middle school and elementary school districts. This will be the third year the NAC has been involved and it is a lot of fun! Ishi Day is on May 7th.
